





HOW HISTORY

Now the first trips to the sod area—Vaughn and River Field. The first few magnificient "landings." Then the first solo—the ice is broken. The long procession of "solo showers." Flying is beginning to be fun.

Out of fourth class, veterans of the class system; look out Able, you best be sharp. More leisure time, with the Cadet Club rocking on Saturday nights; "has she got a friend"—the belles of M.S.C.W. are ceaselessly evaluated. Intra-squadron athletics, and the Cadets and officer students reinforce their comradeship in friendly competion. Bingo on Friday night and the winner buys the beer.

Flying, marching and study—a hard life, but every day is one behind us. Who cares about the work in the warmth of real fraternity? Flying is the common denominator, stripping one of rank and of background; it boils down to this. Mister Can you produce?

Past the forties now, and under the hood. Instruments are easy, it says in the book. Link training, a fiendish mixture of synthetic flight and genuine torture. Navigation classes pay off in the first cross countries; you're on your own now. Snowball is there to help you, but you'll never live it down.

Second class now, and the one cylinder corporals begin throwing their weight around. Real privileges—VOCO's—eighty six men signed out to the Gilmer—trips to Memphis, where "winners" abound. You have to

look sharp now, Mister, you're being rated. Nobody wants rank but everybody's bucking.

Academics get rough—weather! code! weather! code! The spring heat lulls and a movie is fatal. "This Film Is Restricted" and ZZZZzzzzzzzz!!!

Acrobatics begin and a dozen wrists are sprained illustrating slow rolls. This is real flying. The stages are over, thank the Lord. Night flying, night cross country and the final checks are all that stand in our way.

George class graduates, and now we're the wheels. Stripes enough for a squadron of zebras. Time for coffee-hours now; walk to classes by yourself—priveleges unsurpassed. What will it be, Multi's or Jets? Rumors flow taster. "They're only giving acrobatics on the finals now." "It's really strict discipline at Brian, fourth class all over." "They measure your collar brass at Perrin." "I know a guy at—."

The night cross country; man, you'll really check those ETA's. "Pat-rol to Control," I see one heading off to the South—I'll go get him." Everybody back safe, and the last big item besides the final checks out of the way. Final Checks—and checkitis in its finest form. An hour and ten minutes of absolute misery under the hood, and

then: "Okay, Mister, I'll pass you on it this time." Final contact is a breeze—so they say.

The big day draws nearer and nearer. The long riotous week before graduation—no classes, first for chow, swim every afternoon, the safety banquet, the stag party (wow!) the big dance. Then the momentous day arrives—your name is called—this is it—you've made it! Seven never to be forgotten months climaxed by this

single trip across the stage.

It's over now; and after awhile the full realization of graduation sinks in. You are on your way to bigger, faster planes, new places, new friends. But what of the old friends, assigned to different bases? When again will we recount the myriad mishaps that amused or frightened us?
